Nature & Parks

Shakujii Park

One of the best parks in Nerima, Shakujii Park has two large ponds, Shakujii Pond and Sanjoji Pond. The park is also a renowned spot for cherry blossom viewing. In spring, some 240 cherry trees are in full bloom. There is a marsh plant community designated a National Natural Monument at Sanjoji Pond. Visitors can take a small boat out onto Shakujii Pond and on weekends it buses with families all day long.

Forest in Shimizuyama dogtooth violet patch

A forest area with a dogtooth violet patch considered one of the most beautiful in the 23 wards of Tokyo. In spring, some 100 thousand dogtooth violet plants bloom in unison here. The spring which wells up from the ground here has been selected as one of the 57 best springs in Tokyo. Note: In order to preserve the habitat of the dogtooth violets, the area is only open to visitors when the flowers are in bloom.

Shakujii Matsunokaze Bunka Park

A park where you can enjoy sports and culture surrounded by nature. In addition to tennis courts and other sports facilities, the park has a rest area enclosed by a grove of 20 Japanese red pines from which the park gets its name as well as a different rest area surrounded by azaleas and trees.

Special exhibitions focusing on various themes related to Dr. Makino and plants are also held here.

Mandala Museum of Kanzeuin Temple

A museum dedicated to mandala artwork operated by the Kanzeon Temple. The collection is focused on the Kanzeon Ryobu mandalas, and there are also Japanese and Nepalese Buddhist paintings, Siddhams (Sanskrit scripts), Mihira folk art paintings, mihamas, etc. on display.

Musashi University Auditorium

The auditorium was built in 1928 as a facility for the former Musashi High School. It was designed by renowned Japanese architect Koichi Sato, who also built Okuma Auditorium at Waseda University and Hibiya Public Hall. The design reflects the architectural style that was in fashion at the time.

Nio-mon Gate of Chomeiji Temple

A gate with a gabled, hipped roof covered with copper sheets. The gate is the oldest standing structure in Nerima and is an example of Japanese architecture from the second half of the 17th century.

Shoromon Gate of Nanzojin Temple

A large temple gate approximately 10 meters tall. The gate has an upper level with a bronze temple bell, a rather unusual style in Nerima. Based on the architectural style, the gate is believed to have been constructed in the mid-Edo period.

NERIMA ART MUSEUM

An art museum with a collection of some 7,500 works (including donated and loaned items) primarily by modern artists. During exhibitions, the museum holds gallery talks and other events.

Bijutsunomori Ryokuchi Park

32 sculptures modeled after animals and plants are displayed on the natural lawn of this park's grounds. Visitors can look, touch, and let their imaginations run wild in this "fantasy art zoo."

Vertical Caves Ruined Site of Kurihara Conduits

An archeological dig conducted in the area from 1955 to 1956 found three Yayoi period caves and 15 Nara and Heian period caves. Through this reconstruction of a Nara period vertical cave, visitors can catch a glimpse of the simple life people lead in the region at that time.

Heisei Tsutsuji Park

A park which becomes splashed with color in spring when countless azaleas come into bloom. Azaleas are the official flower of Nerima. An abundant number and variety of azaleas grow on the park's grounds, and visitors can see rare varieties such as the Nerima-no-kagami.

Forest in Inariyama

The largest forest area in Nerima. Sawtooth oak, konara oak, Japanese snowbell, and a variety of other deciduous trees grow here. Visitors can enjoy the sight of various seasonal plants growing wild. A spring wells up from the ground on a tree-covered slope in the forest.

Johoku-Chuo Park

A park straddling the cities of Nerima and Itabashi. The park has baseball grounds, a track-and-field ground, tennis courts, and more, and it buses with local residents on weekends. Many cherry and other trees grow on the park grounds, and visitors can enjoy the sight of various seasonal plants growing wild. A spring wells up from the ground on a tree-covered slope in the forest in the middle of the city.

Big Zelkova Tree of Nerima Hakusan-jinja Shrine

This 19 meter tall zelkova tree is estimated to be around 800 years old. A designated National Natural Monument, the tree is said to have been presented to the shrine by Minamoto no Yoshie in 1083 to pray for victory in battle.

CHIHIRO ART MUSEUM TOKYO

An art museum dedicated to displaying works by Chihiro Iwasaki, a painter who created art centering around the theme of children and whose works stand out due to their transparent colors, wasaki lived in Shinjuku-ku, Nerima for 22 years until she passed away in 1974, leaving behind a large body of work. The museum includes an exhibition room, a rest area, and a cafe.

Shakuijo-jo Castle Ruins

Shakuijo-jo Castle was destroyed after an assault by Ota Dokan in 1477 when Toshiama Yasutsune (Kageyasu's younger brother) was lord. The castle was located on a plateau overlooking the Sakujii River and Sanjoji Pond. The earthwork on which the castle's main enclosure was built and the castle's dry moat still exist today.

Kyu-Uchida-ke Residence

This former private home, built in Nerima around 1890, was moved to its current location in Kubochishiro Park in 2010 to serve as part of the Furusato Museum's outdoor exhibitions. The residence has a thatched hipped roof, and visitors can enter and view its tatami rooms, dirt floor work room, and living area with suriken hearth.

Hikarigaoka Museum of Art

An art museum standing in a quiet area surrounded by trees. The museum collection focuses on Japanese paintings, ceramics, and woodblock prints. A cafe restaurant and ceramics classroom also operate at the site.

Fujizuka of Ekoda

A Fujizuka partially covered in volcanic rock situated on the grounds of Senjojiji Shrine. Approximately eight meters tall and 30 meters in diameter, it is one of the largest Fujizuka in Tokyo and is a nationally designated Tangible Folk Cultural Property. It is opened to climbing by the general public during the first three days of the New Year, on the start of mountain-climbing season on July 1, and during the shrine's festival in September.

Fujizuka of Shimo-Nerima

A Fujizuka approximately five meters tall and 15 meters in diameter standing on the grounds of Senjojiji Shrine. The mound is characterized by a design meant to strongly evoke images of Mt. Fuji, including the placement of stones representing the various stations on the climbing trail on the real Fuji. Said to have been constructed in the Edo period, even today the mound is still opened up for climbing at the start of mountain climbing season on July 1.

Fujizuka of Nakazato

A large Fujizuka 12 meters tall and 30 meters in diameter at the base standing beside Yaesaka-jinja Shrine. Like the real Mt. Fuji, this Fujizuka has a trail extending from the first station at the base all the way to the top, climbers following the trail will encounter 36 stone monuments.

Forest in Nakazato hometown

A green space which makes use of a grove of trees surrounding a residence that has stood in the area for over 100 years. In the Mori no Gakushuho building, visitors can learn about the plants and animals found in Nerima, and a variety of programs in which participants can interact with nature are held every Sunday.

NERIMARU, Nerima's Official Anime Character

NERIMARU came into being in March 2011 to promote Nerima around the world as an animation mecca. The name comes from the city's name and the word maru (round), which suggests cuteness. NERIMARU is popular and in demand for appearances at Nerima festivals and events.

Festivals and Events

Check out these must-see seasonal festivals and events! *Subject to changes or cancellation according to the situation.

- April**
 - 4th Sunday** (Sometimes held in May instead)
 - Teruhime Festival**

This festival is conducted to remember Teruhime, a tragic heroine in Nerima's history. Performers dressed in period costumes parade around the Shakujii Park area. In addition to various stage events, there are a large number of food and drink stands.
- May**
 - 2nd Saturday**
 - Nerima Children's Festival**

Children's centers (17, Nerima Welfare Cultural Center, community assembly hall (2)). Games, craft-making and other events that parents and children can enjoy together can be found at each of the above venues.

Workshops and character shows are held at various venues near the north gate of Oizumi-gakuen Station. The whole Oizumi area becomes caught up in anime on this day.

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What kind of place is Nerima?

- Tokyo's Newest Ward!**
Nerima is the newest of Tokyo's 23 wards. Previously part of rather expansive Itabashi Ward, Nerima became independent on August 1, 1987. This administrative five change freed residents from having to travel the long distance to Itabashi City Office. Even today, the two municipalities are like siblings.
- Current Population: 799,100!**
Of Tokyo's 23 wards, Nerima is Tokyo's second most populous! At 48.08 square kilometers, it is Tokyo's fifth largest ward by area, equivalent to 1,022 Tokyo Domes. It also has the largest number of parks, with 691. *The population ranking is current as of August 1, 2022. The area of Tokyo Dome is 0.047 square kilometers.
- The Most Agricultural Land in the 23 Wards!**
Nerima is full of natural attractions, including the only farm in Tokyo's 23 wards and Tokyo's first wine production facility. Nerima farmers also grow various kinds of vegetables, which are used at various local restaurants.

Be sure to make use of Nerima's tourist information centers!

There are two tourist information centers in Nerima. Both are located right next to or in train stations - Nerima Station and Shakujii Station. These centers also sell NERIMARU (Nerima's official anime character) as well as merchandise (recommended Nerima souvenirs and menu selections from well-established local restaurants), traditional crafts, etc. for everyday use and as gifts for people outside the ward. And of course they're ready to give you top-quality information about seasonal tourist spots and events in Nerima! Feel free to ask staff members for help with anything you may need.

- Nerima Tourist Information Center** (MAP H-5)




